

New BCHS Website Goes Online

New Features, More Information, Photos, Downloadable Forms and Much More Now Available

In an effort to provide more information to our patrons and to communicate more effectively with the public, the BCHS Board of Trustees approved the creation of a new website to replace the site that has been online since 2002.

The differences between the old and new sites are many. Most important among these however, is the opportunity to maintain and update the website in-house, an option not previously available.

If you are looking for a piece of information on the site, you should begin with the navigation bar at the top of the page. There are eight overall sections to the site which are similar to chapters in a book. These sections are: Museum, Library, About BCHS, Events, Become a Member, Plan a Visit, Gift Shop, and Contact. By clicking on a sec-



tion, you will bring up a menu in the left sidebar. Each item in the sidebar is a page that relates to the overall chapter.

For example, if you want to know how to submit a research request, you would click on *Library* in the main navigation bar and then click on *Research Requests* in the left sidebar. The page will give you all of the information that you need to know when submitting a request. This page features a Research Request form that you can download, fill out and mail to us.

If you are planning to visit the historical society, click on *Plan a Visit*. In the sidebar you will find pages that list directions to our facility, parking information, a link to the local Visitors Bureau where you can find lodging information, a map of Towanda's Historic District, a list (by town) of historic monuments and markers throughout the county, and links to all of Bradford County's museums so that you can plan to visit several attractions while in our area.

Under Events, you can always know what is happening at BCHS

JUNE 19 SPINNING & WEAVING IN BRADFORD COUNTY & THE ENDLESS MOUNTAINS A Historical Presentation by the Home Textile Tool Museum

Presented by Victor Hilts from the Home Textile Tool Museum in Rome, PA, this program will feature a history of spinning and weaving in Bradford County and the Endless Mountains. See a demonstration of spinning wheels by HTTM volunteers. A few examples of locally made coverlets will be on display from the collection of the Bradford County Historical Society.

JULY 17 THE TOWANDA QUEEN

This program will feature a movie made in Towanda in 1934 entitled, "The Towanda Queen." This movie was produced by the Consolidated Film Producers of Los Angeles, California. It featured local characters such as Bradford County Sheriff, Howard L. Bailey; Lang Dayton; Anna M. Parsons; Richard

Wilt; and more. Come and get a glimpse of 1934 Towanda on the 75th anniversary of the making of this film.

AUGUST 21 THE BRINKS ROBBERY

Presented by Guy Abell, a member of the Board of Trustees of the Bradford County Historical Society. Known as "the crime of the century," the armed robbery of the Brinks Building in Boston, Massachusetts, took place on January 17, 1950. Learn how Bradford County helped break this sensational case.

SEPTEMBER 18 THE PITTSBURGH, BINGHAMTON, & EASTERN: THE RISE AND FALL OF A **BRADFORD COUNTY RAILROAD**

A PowerPoint presentation by Matthew Carl, BCHS Curator. Originally proposed as an electric trolley system, the valley of the Towanda Creek contains the remnants of a steam railroad that never ran. The
